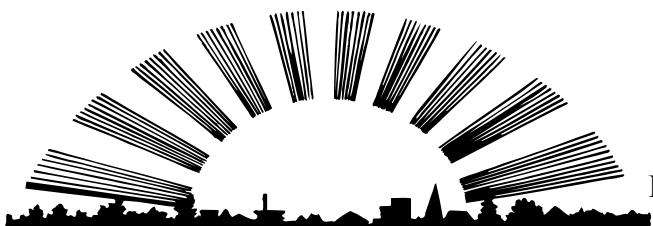

Pastor's Corner July 2007

I'm sitting on my side deck this morning looking out over the lake and believe it or not... there are no spider webs or spiders crawling around. Thank God for the spider man who visited my home last month.

We live in a beautiful community, don't we?

The beauty of the morning breeze, the beauty of the lake, and the beauty of God's people are all blessings from God. These blessings from God sometimes go unnoticed as we get caught up in our everyday lives. Take a moment to notice the breeze, take a moment to notice the water, take a moment to notice His people, and most of all take a moment to notice God in your life.

In June, I took a moment with God to reflect on my own moments with Him here in Conneaut. I took a few days outside of my normal day off because I'd neglected to honor my day off. That, as we all, know is not healthy. We live in a community that promotes healthy living, evident by all the walkers coming by my house this morning; also evident through the Township Park's new walking path.

The area we most often forget about when it comes to our health is our spirituality. How does your spirit get renewed? Spirituality comes through many aspects of Christian living. We find spirituality through our worship, through our prayer life, through our fellowship with others, and through our giving. Spiritual health is vital to your life more so than any part of your physical health. Spiritual health exists beyond this mortal life, which is God's promise to us.

Being healthy brings up another aspect of our relationship in two ways. I am making a commitment to eat healthier so that I can serve you longer and better. I can only do this with your help. Please help me stay with you longer by allowing me to turn down the cake you bring to the office or the slice of pie that you offer and, unfortunately, the sweet breads on Sunday morning.

The second area of health that we need to reflect on is God's church in Conneaut. GSLC has grown over the past two years. It has become healthy in mission and ministry but unhealthy in supporting the mission and ministry. Now before you roll your eyes and say, "here we go again" *I almost never appeal to you in this way* and I want you to take a moment to feel and see the beauty of God's blessings at GSLC. Your financial support is what keeps the ministry of GSLC stable and moving in the community. The capital campaign is separate from the general giving and the general giving is what supports the mission of God's church from outreach to staff. GSLC is larger than when I arrived and we have grown in the community as well. But we are on the verge of losing staff because we have not met the voted on and approved budget. **We are dangerously unhealthy and, unfortunately,** there is no more reserve for the church to fall back on. **The continued health of the congregation depends on your weekly gifts.** How you respond to this letter of education, will determine the mission of God's church. It's not up to someone else. It's up to you and each disciple of Christ here at GSLC.

I pray that you can receive this request in love as we share together the ministry God has given to us at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church.

- One pair blunt scissors (safety scissors with imbedded steel blades work well)
- One 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- One pencil sharpener
- Six new pencils with erasers
- One eraser approximately 2-1/2" long
- 12 sheets of construction paper in assorted colors
- One box of 8, 16, or 24 crayons

All completed grocery bags need to be turned in by September 30th so that we can assemble the school kits.

GOOD SHEPHERD HONORED AT SYNOD ASSEMBLY

The 552 Lutherans who attended the 2007 Northeastern Ohio Synod Assembly on June 15-16 heard great news about how Good Shepherd Lutheran Church models Biblical principals of stewardship through benevolence. Our congregation was praised as one of the top three congregations in our synod for benevolence giving as a percentage of our total budget. **Congratulations!**

Synod leaders encouraged other congregations to follow our example of including the 10% Biblical tithe to benevolence in our budget, as well as our policy of tithing 10% of all bequests. Pastors also were encouraged to follow Pastor Frank's example to educate parishioners about our responsibility to tithe our first fruits, as the Bible teaches us, rather than our leftovers.

Pastor Frank & Wanda and Duffy & Nancy Guthrie attended the assembly in Akron this year on behalf of Good Shepherd. Newly elected Bishop Elizabeth Eaton led the synod convention for the first time. Bishop Eaton ran a tight ship time-wise, with just the right blend of humor and seriousness, nuts-and-bolts and vision, and she wrapped it all in Christ-like love.

While there, some of our representatives attended an excellent workshop called, "So You Think Your Church is Friendly?" where we took lots of notes to pass on to the appropriate committees at GSLC. How we treat our guests really does matter, and it's the building of relationships that builds the mission of Christ. Speakers also inspired the assembly with stories of our benevolence dollars in action in northeastern Ohio, across the country through our national church body (the ELCA), and through our global mission. Our giving touches the lives of so many.

Duffy and Nancy report that attending the synod assembly was a great experience, and they were grateful for the chance to be there. They learned new tidbits, made good contacts which will benefit GSLC, and had fun, too! They encourage YOU to take advantage of the opportunity to attend next year.
