Pastor's Corner November 2009

“And Jesus told them many things in parables”

The Teacher's Words

Yesterday I sat down to write my letter for our newsletter and just drew a blank. Everything I was thinking came out wrong when I wrote it down on paper. So, I gave it another day, another prayer, another night, another prayer and just when I was about to give up, God spoke to me.

Has that ever happened to you? When it does, what do you do? **I hope you rejoice!**

We live in a different world today don't we? As I sat in my office looking at the “Life” magazine from December 25, 1964 I could see and read how far our society has come. We've changed in many ways, some for the best, others ways for the worse. As I looked at the magazine (a double issue) I wished that our society could reflect the marvelous message from within.

It was pleasantly surprising to see in this magazine the message of God from cover to cover. It began with the Old Testament and ended with the Glory of God in Jesus. Throughout the magazine's New Testament section were Jesus' parables. The words of the teacher became clear and the joy that I felt in reading the words was and is indescribable. Did we really have magazines that devoted an entire issue to God? In another time we did...perhaps not today but I would love to think that it could happen in our time.

I was filled with awe as I read the teachings of Jesus in this edition of Life magazine. And it illustrated his words so that people could use their sense of hearing and seeing. I could hear my voice in my head as I read and saw “The Good Shepherd”, “The Pearl of Great Price”, “The Rich Man and Lazarus”, “The Dishonest Steward”, “The Workers in the Vineyard”, “The Unmerciful Servant”, “The Good Samaritan”, “The Prodigal Son”, and “The Lost Coin”.

I'm sure you've read about these parables and have come to love the teacher's word and his lesson within his word. With the change in our culture and society it becomes more difficult to express Jesus in our World. So I encourage you to open the Bible and read the parables, get in touch with God's Word, and rejoice in his Love. Changing a culture that doesn't lift up Jesus on a day-to-day base is hard when we do it alone. But through Christian unity and God's love we can change the community.

Wouldn't that be refreshing?

“For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith – and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God – not by works, so that no one can Boast.” (Eph. 2:8-9)

THE JOURNEY OF AN OPERATION SHOEBOX GIFT

Pack and pray – The journey starts with you filling a shoebox with toys, school supplies, and necessity items and praying for the child who will receive your gift.

Shoe Box Drop Off – There are more than 2,400 drop-off locations nation wide. The boxes are then transported to regional processing centers.

Processing Center – Tractor-trailers haul boxes to our six regional centers in the United States. Volunteers inspect the boxes and pack them into cartons for overseas delivery.

Overseas Transport – This precious cargo is loaded onto ships and planes and sent to over 100 countries.

Distribution – National Leadership teams oversee the delivery of the boxes to churches, schools, orphanages and children's hospitals.

Wow! – Shoeboxes are only the beginning. Through gospel booklets and discipleship programs, children are introduced to the greatest gift of all – Jesus.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD Dedication Sunday will be November 15th. By packing a shoebox gift, you can share the love of God with lonely boys and girls in the far corners of the globe.

GIFT SUGGESTIONS

SCHOOL SUPPLIES: pens, pencils and sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

TOYS: small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky,[®] etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS: toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

OTHER: hard candy and lollipops, mints, gum (please place all candy in Ziploc bag), T-shirts, socks, ball caps, sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)

A PERSONAL NOTE; You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family (If you include your name and address, the child may write back.)

DO NOT INCLUDE: Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy, liquids or lotions, medications or vitamins, breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers, aerosol cans.

SOCIAL MINISTRY

This year for Thanksgiving, we will be adopting two families in our church. A tree is in the gathering space. Its branches hold paper leaf, pumpkin and turkey cutouts on which are indicated various food and paper products. These items will be given to the families, along with some perishable items purchased with funds collected in the Turkey Box.

What is the TURKEY BOX?

Social Ministry decided to put a box out for people to drop in their change over the year. It was believed that if everyone dropped in their loose change throughout the year, we would be able to help with the needs of our outreach at Thanksgiving and Christmas.

For many years we had relied upon monetary gifts from Thrivent Financial (a fraternal organization formerly known as Lutheran Brotherhood). We have been blessed with thousands of dollars from this group and have used money from them to help with our families over the holidays. However, as the economy changes, Thrivent funds have not been as readily available. These funds are also being used to help our Sunday School, evangelism, and other projects at the church. The turkey box will continue to be out each Sunday. The donations will be kept in a separate account and will be used to help our social ministries.

We will still ask for donations of food and paper products for both Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays. At Christmas, we will be adopting church families and HALO families.
