Subject: Notification of Approved Budget for 2009

At the December 2008 meeting the members in attendance voted approval for the 2009 adjusted budget recommendation. That budget eliminated all funding for Christian Education, Evangelism, Mutual Ministry, Social Ministry and most of Stewardship.

Each of the committees will hold fundraisers to support the specific ministries in their classification. It is **NOT** what we wanted to see. But based on the history of giving from this congregation we cannot continue to end each year with negative giving for ministry support.

The **Positive** news is that our pledge campaign this year is the best you've ever had. We are grateful to those who took the time to pledge. By pledging you help secure a large portion of the budget.

Listed below is the breakdown of pledges for 2009:

Good Shepherd Lutheran Church 2009 budget	\$203,000
94 families pledged	<u>\$149,660</u>
Leaving a difference of	\$ 53,340

106 families did not pledge

Taking the difference needed divide by 106 families \$ 503.21 per family or \$9.68 per week per family.
(Some will be able to do more some will do less)

The numbers above are the reality of our need for God's church at Good Shepherd. We hope that you will continue to pray about your commitment to the ministry of God's church.
