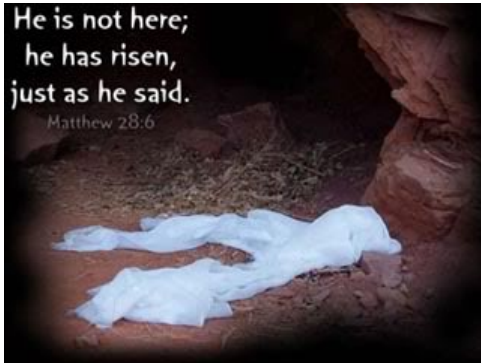

Pastor's Corner April 2010



¹Now after the sabbath, toward the dawn of the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the sepulchre. ²And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone, and sat upon it. ³His appearance was like lightning, and his raiment white as snow. ⁴And for fear of him the guards trembled and became like dead men. ⁵But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. ⁶**He is not here; for he has risen, as he said.** Come, see the place where he lay. ⁷Then go

quickly and tell his disciples that he has risen from the dead, and behold, he is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him. Lo, I have told you." *Matthew 28:1-7*

"Jesus Christ Is Risen Today"... Alleluia!

Christians all over the world celebrate the day that God acted on our behalf. The Easter celebration is a reminder of God's action for humanity almost two thousand years ago. I look forward to seeing you at worship on Easter morning. I encourage you to come and celebrate the gift of eternal life through our Savior Jesus. Come... Worship and sing praises to God.

Dear Friends of Christ:

It has come to my attention that many in our congregation are not aware of the disposition of the \$1,551 donated at the Dedication Day Ceremonies. As Pastor Gore announced from the pulpit a few weeks ago, the \$1,551 was added to the \$67,500 we withdrew from our Permanent Improvement Endowment Fund earnings to make a \$69,051 down payment on our \$530,000 mortgage at Conneaut Savings Bank. This was transacted on February 25, 2010.

Also, we earned \$362 at the Sock Hop last weekend through our bake sale. This money was divided evenly between our Evangelism Outreach Program and our Kitchen Equipment/Expansion Fund. Thank you to the bakers!

RESURRECTION COOKIES

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

INGREDIENTS:

3	Egg Whites	A Zip Lock Baggie
1	Cup Whole Pecans	A Wooden Spoon
1	Teaspoon Vinegar	Tape
	A Pinch of Salt	Bible
1	Cup Sugar	

DIRECTIONS:

Place pecans in zip lock bag and have children beat them with the wooden spoon to break into small pieces. Explain that after Jesus was arrested he was beaten by Roman soldiers.

Read John 19: 1-3

Let each child smell the vinegar. Place vinegar in mixing bowl. Explain that Jesus was thirsty on the cross. He was given vinegar to drink.

Read John 19:28-30

Add egg whites to vinegar. Eggs represent life. Explain that Jesus gave His life for us.

Read John 10:10-11

Sprinkle a little in child's hand. Let them taste it. Add remaining salt to bowl. Explain this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' followers and the bitterness of our own sins.

Read Luke 23:27

So far the ingredients are not very appetizing. Add sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because He loves us. He wants us to know and belong to Him.

Read Psalms 34:8 and John 3:1-3

Beat with mixer on high speed until stiff peaks form. Explain that the color white represents the purity in God's eyes of those whose sins have been cleansed by Jesus.

Read Isaiah 1:18 and John 3:1-3

Fold in broken nuts. Drop by teaspoons onto waxed paper covered cookie sheet. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb that Jesus' body was laid.

Put cookie sheet in oven and close door. Turn oven OFF.

Have the child put a piece of tape and have them "seal" the oven door closed. Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed.

Read John 16:20-22

Go to bed. Explain that they may feel sad to leave the cookies in the oven. Jesus' followers were in despair when the tomb was sealed.

On Easter (Resurrection) morning, unseal the oven and have a cookie. You will notice that the cookies have a cracked surface and a hollow center. CHRIST HAS RISEN!!
