## Pastor's Corner November 2010



“Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. <sup>5</sup> Let all people know your forbearance. The Lord is at hand. <sup>6</sup> Have no anxiety about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. <sup>7</sup> And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, will keep your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup> Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. <sup>9</sup> What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, do; and the God of peace will be with you.” *Philippians 4:4-9*

*Rejoice in the Lord always!*

*Paul calls the followers of Jesus to lift up the name of Christ. Celebrate with the people you love, celebrate with the visitors, and celebrate your life as a servant of Jesus. I say Rejoice!*

Members and Friends of Good Shepherd,

The “Estimate In Giving” or as we know it, the 2011 Pledge continues into November. I hope that you have taken the time to fill out an estimate in giving or pledge. I continue to encourage each of you to place your faith in God and grow one step closer to tithing.

*“Estimating risks in faith; it reflects the need to put God first. Martin Luther said, that every Christian goes through three conversions in Life, – first, the heart, then the head, and finally the purse. For God to be really first in the lives of Christians, all three are necessary. Many Christians find that the last to be converted, the last to be committed to the Lord, is our wealth.”<sup>1</sup>*

Giving is a means of Spiritual growth. When you reach the point of tithing, you will no longer wonder how much you should give, that in itself is a freeing experience. Estimated giving or pledging makes God the God of our lives, not just the God of our church. When we put God first we risk in faith, we trust God to provide, and we are healed from our addiction to “wealth or money”.

*“When we commit our lives to Jesus, we promise that we will dedicate our entire lives to serve God. We devote the rest of our lives to the covenant God made with us in Jesus. When we were brought into the family of God, we vowed that we would serve our Lord for the rest of our lives. Therefore, as we make our estimate of giving (pledge), we are renewing our covenant with God. The side effect of that commitment is true freedom and spiritual growth.”<sup>2</sup>*

## A Moment in Faith

There is a Book that I just finished reading that I'd like to talk about. I've always heard about this Book but never took the time to read it. Well, last month I finished it and it only took me a whole year to do it! This Book will take you on a journey that you have never been on. You will travel to places most of us have never heard of or seen. The travels are long, but very interesting and you won't want to put the Book down. It's chapters are many with a cast of characters you won't believe! The Book wasn't easy to read, in fact I wanted to quit several times but didn't and ended up with a better understanding of the central figure of it. I'll honestly admit that at my age, I didn't know much about the story contained in this book. There is a lot to remember but it's the type of Book you can always go back to read over and over. If, when we read the Bible, we don't understand something, make it a point to ask someone who does know. In Acts 8:29-35, we see Philip stop and talk to a man reading the Scriptures. The Holy Spirit tells Philip to go to the man and ask him, "Do you understand what you are reading?" The man replied: "How can I unless someone instructs me?" So Philip sits with the man and explains the Good News of the Lord.

**"The Bible"**! What a great book to read! Love it, learn it, and believe it, because it is for believers of all ages. We see in I John 2: 12-14 how the "young in faith" battled and won the battle against Satan's temptations. Each stage of life in the Christian pilgrimage builds upon each other. When children learn about Christ, they grow in the ability to win battles with temptations. As young adults move from victory to victory, they grow in their relationship with Christ. Then as older adults having known Christ for years, they develop the wisdom needed to teach young people and start the cycle all over again! It's up to all of us to keep the cycle going.

There is a car commercial on T.V. from Toyota that says: "If you want to know about the quality of their cars ask someone who drives one." So too, if you want to know about the quality of a Christian life, ask someone who has read the Book and lives the quality life that is described in the pages of "The Bible".
