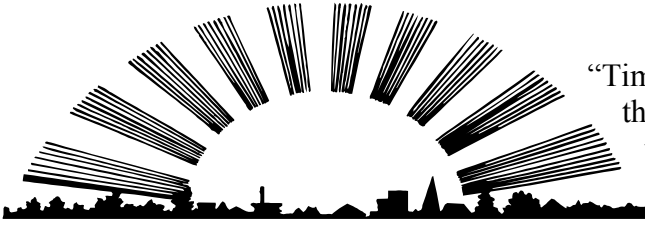

Pastor's Corner October 2011



“Time Travel” is something we all do as we reflect back to the day... It seems that everything was better. The grass was greener, the sky held less clouds with brighter blues, the neighborhood was clean and well groomed. Even the church was better back in the day... we didn't face the issues of money, attendance, and controversy.

Well, I just did some time traveling thanks to Jack and April Sabo. Jack dropped off his uncle's newsletter from the summer of 1957, June and July to be exact. As I read through Jack Marttila's newsletter from “The Conneaut Evangelical Lutheran Church”, I was fascinated to learn some of the items the pastor was dealing with “back in the day”. On the back of this page you will see the copied pages of the 1957 newsletter.

It was interesting to learn how the newsletter was done and how many hours it took to put it together and make copies (not run copies). The pastor and volunteer staff were concerned because they could no longer make-up the newsletter in Finnish. They justified their actions by accepting as their own, the members, who now read the “News Herald” in English. The church was talking about mergers of the Synod as well as congregations. The church sent Janice Niinisto, Sandy Hennessey, Eli Hirsimaki, and Susan Manniko as delegates to the church convention where they would discuss and vote on the merger.

The church in 1957 was having a decrease in attendance during the summer months. Attendance was down from 140 to 67 people each week and the pastor wrote about that. The stewardship committee was also concerned with financial support as well as volunteer actions. They spoke about the need of the people to support God's church.

“Time Travel”... If one could look at where we are today in comparison they might find it humorous that the church continues to struggle with the same issues while it flourishes with other areas. Summer attendance still declines; stewardship of God's church is still taboo to talk about openly; controversial items at church conventions still happen; and God's church continues to move forward in growth, love, and fellowship.

One of the blessings I see from going on this paper journey is the church. I witness to the living God that strengthens our community then and now. There will always be challenges to face but as we face them together with God, we can overcome them. We've traveled a long way from where Jack Marttila's newsletter appeared. Now Jack and April and many of you can say that you are part of God's family here at Good Shepherd. You are traveling with God through time.

A Moment In Faith

To go to church or not go, we've all been there. At some time or another we seem to find any old excuse not to go to church. It might be a headache or maybe you were out late the night before or you might want to go out of town to go shopping or you might feel that nobody at church will miss you. Isn't it easy, so very easy, to find an excuse not to go to church? Maybe if we spent as much time looking for reasons to go to church instead of reasons not to go, our faith would have a chance to grow.

In order to grow spiritually, going to church is just as important as exercising for a healthy life. Our spiritual life needs to be healthy also, so that our relationship with God will grow and be healthy. I like going to church on Sunday because it makes me feel closer to God, it lifts my spirits, and it strengthens my faith. If we are to be serious about our faith, and grow in our spiritual life, what better place to be than at church with people who share the same interests and beliefs.

Many people say you don't need to go to church to be close to God, that you can just read the Bible and say prayers and get the same results. Well, that may be true, just how many of us do that? It's like going to a meeting for alcohol addicts or a drug rehab program or a meeting where everyone is watching their weight. You need the support of those around you to get your life back on track and at church you get that same support and help from those worshipping with you. It really helps. It really does!

If we work hard to find a church where we can make a connection with others, we would find more ways to serve the Lord. When we have that connection, we will also find that making a contribution to our church in some way will become easier and more fulfilling.

Church attendance according to a recent poll shows some interesting figures. It shows 80% of the people said that they were Christians but only 47% went to church on a regular basis. More revealing, was 31% admitted that they haven't been to church in the past 6 months unless it was for a funeral or a wedding. Among those who said they were Catholics, only 49% said they went to church weekly. For "born-again" Christians it was 59% and for those in the general Protestant category weekly attendance was fewer than 50%.

Some people might say, "I don't need someone preaching to me". That may be so but what you do need is someone reminding you about the dangers of gossip, about the need to be more patient with others, or the need to be more charitable with one another. These are all good things that you can get from the Pastor's messages on Sunday, and we still need to hear them from time to time. A good church is the place for that and a good church will supply the right medicine for what ails you spiritually. All you have to do is be willing to make the effort to attend church on a weekly basis. As an old television commercial said many years ago, "try it, you'll like it!"
