A Moment In Faith
By Richard P. Tulino, A Layman's Interpretation

We're number 1! The greatest, strongest, prettiest, and the champions! Almost daily such words as these are used in our lives. Everyone wants to be associated with a winner. Losers are those who finish less than first. But in direct contrast are the words of Jesus: "And whoever wants to be first must be a slave of everyone else. For even the Son of Man came here not to be served, but to serve others and give his life as a ransom for many". (Mark: 10 Verses 44 & 45) Jesus is the Greatest, God Incarnate, our Messiah, but He entered history as a servant.

This is the message from Mark. His message was written to encourage Christians and to prove without a doubt, that Jesus is the Messiah. Mark tells us, in rapid succession, stories of Jesus in action, His true identity revealed by what He does and not necessarily by what He says. It is Jesus on the move! Mark tells us dramatic action packed stories. He gives us the most vivid accounts of Christ's activities. He features facts and actions rather than teachings. The way Jesus lived His life is the perfect example of how we should live our lives today.

Mark begins with John the Baptist teaching. Then He moves quickly past Jesus' baptism, temptation in the wilderness and call of the disciples, Mark takes us right into the public ministry of Jesus. We see Jesus confronting a demon, healing a man with leprosy, and forgiving and healing the paralyzed man brought into Jesus' presence by friends.

In Chapter 4 Mark pauses to give us a sample of Jesus' teaching, the parable of a farmer and illustration of the mustard seed, and then Jesus plunges back into action by calming the waves, driving out demons and raising the daughter of Jairus from the dead.

Then Jesus returns to Nazareth, where He experiences rejection from His home town and calls for the disciples to spread the good news everywhere. Even with opposition increasing from Herod and the Pharisees and the killing of John the Baptist, Jesus continues to move feeding 5,000 people, reaching out to the woman from Syrian Phoenicia, healing the deaf man and again feeding 4,000 people. Finally it's time to reveal His true identity to His disciples. Do they really know who Jesus is? Peter proclaims Him as the Messiah but doesn't quite know what Jesus' mission is.

Jesus continues to teach and heal and events move rapidly toward a climax. The Last Supper, The Betrayal, The Crucifixion, and The Resurrection are dramatically portrayed and we see more examples of Jesus' teachings. Mark shows us Jesus moving, serving, sacrificing, and saving. As you read the Gospels of Mark be ready for the action packed stories and be open for God's move into your lives, and be challenged to move into our world to serve God the best way we can.

SHARING THROUGHOUT THE HOLIDAYS

This year for Thanksgiving, we will be providing grocery items for two of our church families as well as sending a dinner to six of our shut-ins. We have also forwarded \$150 to the Food Pantry. In the past, we sent canned goods, but have learned that cash donations will go farther as the Food Pantry can purchase food at a drastic savings from the food bank in Cleveland. ALL THE MONEY FOR OUR THANKSGIVING OUTREACH HAS COME FROM THE TURKEY BOX. PLEASE CONTINUE TO DROP IN YOUR SPARE CHANGE SO THAT WE CAN REPLENISH THE FUNDS AND CAN PROVIDE FOR CHRISTMAS FAMILIES.

Attention Cookie Bakers: We are asking for donations of two dozen holiday cookies. We are planning to give cookies to our shut-ins and HALO families. We believe this will add a homey touch to the holiday gifts. A sign-up sheet will be posted on the kiosk.

We have learned of an overwhelming need for **underwear** and **socks** for the Conneaut school children. Many children come to school wearing neither. A clothes basket will be placed near the Christmas tree in the gathering space for your donations. This mission will take the place of the mitten and hat Tree of Warmth.

We will be adopting eight families (representing 22 people) for Christmas. Within this group are two church families. Please consider taking a few ornaments from the tree in the gathering space, purchasing the **food, paper products**, and/or **personal gift** items represented on the ornaments, and then returning the items to the gathering space.

Dear Friends in Christ,

For many years, I have been a part of the Social Ministry team. This year I am serving as chairperson.

A few weeks ago, Sue Chapin and I visited Renea Roach at the Human Resource Center to get a list of our HALO people. We left with very heavy hearts. The Food Pantry shelves are almost bare, and the HALO list keeps getting bigger. Many of the names submitted will not get adopted for Christmas!

When I began contacting our HALO list, I talked to a middle-aged woman who had always worked, but due to health issues now cannot. She is just trying to survive as she awaits disability. She does not have money for paper products. One cannot use food stamps to purchase these items. Can you imagine not having toilet paper? A group of women at church are gathering some items and will be taking them to her house. I relay this story to you as I wish we could do more for this person and the many other adults and children in our area.

Please consider putting some paper products in the grocery cart, or better yet...why not adopt a family from HALO? God has blessed each of us with so much. Maybe we should all start a new Christmas tradition.

Please remember, giving to others continues even after the glow of Christmas is gone.
