Merry Christmas!

It was great seeing everyone on Christmas Eve. I hope that you enjoyed the service you attended. I enjoyed each of the services at the church that evening. The Holy Spirit filled the worship space as we once again heard the story of Jesus' birth. Our voices came together in word and song as we praised God for the joy and the underserved gift of Jesus. A Moment In Faith

A new day, a new month, a new year, a new birth. January begins a new time in our lives. Having just celebrated the birth of Jesus we start many new things, I thought I'd look through the Bible to see how many times the word new was used to refer to something. I came across 19 references of the word new. Now, I won't go through them all but I thought I'd look at several references.

In Psalm 98 the first verse says: *"Sing a new song to the Lord, for He has done wonderful deeds. His right hand has won a mighty victory, His holy arm has shown His saving power!"* This is a Psalm of praise, anticipating the coming of God to rule His people. Jesus fulfilled this anticipation when he came to save all people from their sins (98:2,3) and He will come again to judge the world. (98:8,9). We see in Psalm 98 that God is both perfectly loving and perfectly just. He is merciful when He punishes and He overlooks no sin when He loves us. So we should praise Him for His promise to save us, and we should look forward and be ready for His return.

In Jeremiah (31:31) we see the word new used, *"The day is coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the people of Israel and Judah."* This covenant won't be like the one the Lord made with their ancestors when he brought them by His hand out of the land of Egypt. The Lord goes on to say that, *"This is the new covenant that I will make with the peoples of Israel on that day." "I will put my instructions deep within them and I will write them on their hearts."* God would write his law on their hearts rather than on tablets of stone as he did the Ten Commandments. In (17:1) their sin was engraved on their hearts so that they wanted above all to disobey. This change seems to describe an experience very much like the new birth, with God taking the initiative. When we turn our life over to God, he, by His Holy Spirit, builds into us the desire to obey him.

In Ezekiel (36:26) we hear the Lord say: *"And I will give you a new heart, and I will put a new spirit in you so that you will follow my decrees and be careful to obey my regulations."* God promised to restore Israel not only physically but spiritually and to accomplish this God would give them a new heart for following him and put his Spirit within them to transform them and empower them to do his will. Again the new covenant was promised ultimately to be fulfilled in Christ. No matter how impure your life is right now, God offers you a fresh start. You can have your sins washed away, receive a new heart for God, and have his Spirit within you, if you accept God's promise. Why try to patch up your old life when you can have a new one?

In Luke (22:20) we hear the words of Jesus at the Last Supper when he takes the cup and says, *"This cup in the new covenant between God and His people, an agreement confirmed with my blood, which is poured out as a sacrifice for you."*

In Old Testament times, God agreed to forgive people's sins if they brought animals to the priest for sacrifice. When this practice started, the covenant between God and His people was sealed with the blood of animals. We all know that it wasn't the animal blood that removed the sins, but God, for he was the only one who could forgive sins. Under Jesus' "new covenant" between God and his people, Jesus would die in the place of sinners, and his blood (because he is God) would remove the sins of all who put their faith in him. Jesus' sacrifice would never have to be repeated, like the animal sacrifices had to be, it would be good for all eternity. Remember the words of John the Baptist in John (1:29) when he called Jesus, *"The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world."*

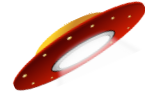
