

## Pastor's Corner February 2011



<sup>22</sup> Then Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. <sup>23</sup> For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. <sup>24</sup> The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, <sup>25</sup> nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. <sup>26</sup> From one ancestor<sup>1</sup> he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, <sup>27</sup> so that they would search for God<sup>1</sup> and perhaps grope for him and find him -- though indeed he is not far from each one of us. <sup>28</sup> For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said, 'For we too are his offspring.' <sup>29</sup> Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. <sup>30</sup> While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent" (Acts 17:22-30)

Paul speaks to the people of Athens in Acts about who they worship and what they are about. He is trying to get them to understand that they worship everything but not the true God. The people want to hear and learn about new things and the new ways of "the gods" but don't have any idea of their unknown God. It is an opportunity for Paul to teach and he does. The evangelist fills the air with his voice as he teaches the people of Athens about God the creator of heaven and earth. The moment is not lost and we as a people of God still need to listen and learn.

There are times when we forget that we belong to God. It's fairly easy to remember what we want and what we need but to remember that God is with us in all things? That isn't always on the minds of the members of the church. How do we relate to our God and his life with us?

I was at a game dinner last month with a group of men from the church. We ate a variety of different samplers from the buffet table. It was good fellowship and fun being with a group of Christian men. The guest speaker stepped up and began to speak about his identity and what he's known for. He asked a simple question to the 400 plus people gathered, "What are you about?" My answer without question or thinking was "GOD". I wrote down on the card in front of me "GOD".

I may be different in my vocation and call as pastor at Good Shepherd, but I don't believe I'm alone in my understanding of who I am. I am a child of God. Loved and Saved through his Son Jesus. It is of God's doing and not of my own. But that question got me thinking, "What are we about as a church?"

**If you feel brave enough to answer the question, I'd like to hear from you. "What are we about as a church?"** Many of you have done this before but just in case there is someone new to the question and answer sessions... ## A Moment In Faith

Did you ever feel that you don't have the motivation or energy to complete a task you have started? Have the everyday duties of life, family or work become a heavy burden? Has the "wind beneath your wings" died? Do you feel like the "breath of life" has been knocked out of you?

Then you need INSPIRATION!

In the practical areas of life it may be easy to identify the ruts we are in, but we may find it hard to break patterns of thinking and behavior that cut deep into our souls. These things are very hard to change. We need inspiration, the kind of inspiration that comes from Scripture! Why as Christians should we look to The Bible for inspiration? The reason is that the Scriptures claim to be inspired by God. In (2 Timothy 3:16) we read: All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful to teach what is true and to make us realize what is wrong in our lives. It corrects us when we are wrong and teaches us to do what is right.

We have to look at The Bible, not as a collection of stories, fables, myths, or merely human ideas about God. It is not a human book! It is a book that God, through the Holy Spirit, revealed his person and plan, to certain believers who wrote down his message for his people (2 Peter 1:20-21). This process is known as inspiration! These writers wrote from their own personal, historical, and cultural contexts. Although they used their own minds, talents, language, and style, they wrote what God wanted or inspired them to write. We know The Bible is trustworthy because God was in control of its writing.

The biblical word inspiration comes from a word meaning "breathed out of God." Portions of Scripture attribute creation of mind and the universe to the creative breath of God, the biblical claim to inspiration means that God is the author of its message. The whole Bible is God's inspired word. Because it is inspired and trustworthy, we should read it and apply it to our lives.

The Bible's divine origin makes sure the essential qualities needed for us to be inspired: the authorship, quality, reliability, durability, and authority of Scripture. The quality of inspiration is due to Scripture's divine origin. We look at a work of art to reflect the artist's excellence, so to the excellence of Scripture's message reflects the character of its author.

The character of Scripture assures us of its reliability. After all, The Bible is as flawless as The God who gave it to us. Christianity believes in the trustworthiness of Scripture because of the character of God. If God can not lie, and God gave us the Scriptures, then we have to have faith in the infallibility of Scripture. The durability of Scripture ensures the inspiration is long lasting. We don't need a quick breath of inspiration; we need it to last a long time. Jesus said, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will never pass away."

As Christians we recognize that not all peoples share our views regarding Scripture, but we are encouraged to consider that its divine origin is the sole authority that guides our beliefs and that it helps us to fulfill our need for INSPIRATION!

May you be INSPIRED to read and spread the Good News of The Bible!!

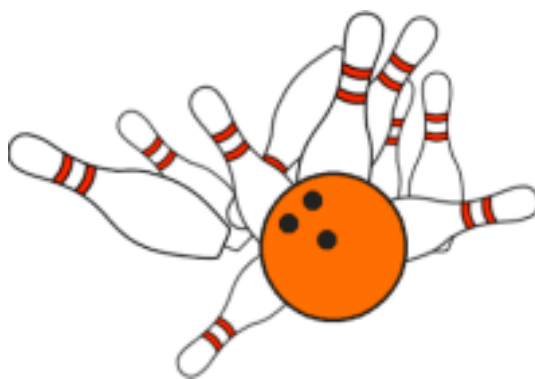
